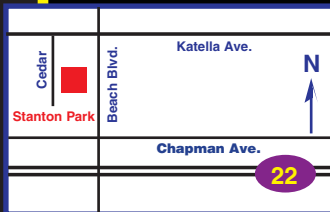

General Plan Update Released

A comprehensive update to the City's 1992 General Plan has been released for public review. Required by state law, the General Plan can be thought of as a guide or "blue print" to a city's community and economic development goals. The General Plan describes Stanton's goals and strategies relating to land use, economic development, transportation, housing, open space/conservation, safety, public facilities, infrastructure and community design. Along with these goals and strategies, the General Plan includes an action plan that is geared to carrying out these goals and strategies. This action plan will help establish funding and work priorities for the City during the 20 year life of the General Plan.

The General Plan's draft environmental impact report (EIR) is scheduled to be released in the near future. An EIR is a report that examines the impacts (traffic, noise, demands on city services, etc.) attributed to developing Stanton as called for in the General Plan. This report, along with the General Plan, will come before the City Planning Commission and City Council in the coming months for review and adoption.

Copies of the Public Review Draft General Plan are available for review or purchase at City Hall in printed form. The General Plan is also available for purchase on a CD-ROM, or for review on the City's website, at www.ci.stanton.ca.us. The EIR will also be available for public review when available.

Business License Compliance Program

The City of Stanton has retained the firm of Municipal Auditing Services (MAS) to assist with a compliance review of the City's business license tax ordinance, for the applicable years 2005-to-date. In this regard MAS is authorized to operate under the rules of the City's business license tax ordinance. To view information regarding business license tax, please visit www.infomas.org/Stanton. Per the City of Stanton Municipal Ordinance, it is unlawful for any person, either for himself or for any other person, to commence, conduct, carry on, or engage in any business in the City without first having procured a license from the city, or without complying with any and all regulations of such business contained in the City of Stanton Municipal Ordinance. Over the next year and a half MAS will be conducting the business license compliance program. These loans are interest free with deferred payments until the property is sold, refinanced or a change in title occurs. This is accomplished by offering loans to eligible homeowners that meet the income requirements.

The Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program's purpose is to assist Stanton's homeowners with code violations, eliminating unsafe, unsanitary, and deteriorating living conditions.

Answers to the quiz "Going Green":

- A** – hand washing dishes can use up to 50 percent more water than a water-saving, energy-efficient dishwasher. However, dishwashers made before 1994 use more water than current models. Look for units with the Energy Star rating.
- D** – manufacturing and disposing of both paper and plastic bags harms the environment. Bring your own re-useable bags instead.
- B** – many appliances continue to use energy for features like clocks and remote control sensors even when they're turned off. According to the Department of Energy, the electricity consumed by televisions that are turned off but still plugged in costs U.S. households more than \$750 million a year.
- B** – Hybrid cars perform on par with or better than conventional cars in drivability and safety testing.
- C** – Only about 8 percent of global energy comes from renewables. The remaining 92 percent comes from non-renewable sources like oil, coal, and natural gas.
- D** – According to the U.S. environmental Protection Agency, CFLs use 2/3 less energy than standard incandescent bulbs and last up to 10 times longer. Replacing a 60-watt incandescent with a 13 watt CFL will save about \$30 in energy costs over the life of the bulb.
- B** – It is always better to turn lights off when not in use and there is no additional energy requirement for starting a CFL bulb.
- B** – The EPA estimates you save about 15 percent on fuel by driving 55 miles (88 Kilometers) per hour rather than 65 miles (105 Kilometers) per hour. Property inflated tires and a well-tuned engine also improve fuel economy.
- C** – Each degree you drop the thermostat during winter saves about 5% on your heating bill. For air conditioning, set the thermostat to 78 degrees Fahrenheit (25.6 degrees Celsius) or higher.
- D** – All of these materials can produce paper. Hemp, the more humane and clean option, requires less land acreage to grow than timber, has fewer chemical byproducts, and can be recycled more frequently than tree fiber.
